




English		Maths		
<p>In English, we will be looking at Holes by Louis Sachar and using it as a basis for a non-chronological report and a narrative, where they will learn to speak like a Texan! In reading, our focus will continue with The Boy in the Tower by Polly Ho-Yen, a surreal, dystopian fable which will have the children gripping the edge of their seats! Then we will move onto local history guides and booklets which fit nicely with our History and Geography topics.</p>		<p>For Year 6, we shall make sure they are secondary school ready and cover the trickier aspects of ratio proportion and algebra. They will also be carrying out bigger Maths projects where they can apply their knowledge in realistic settings.</p> <p>Year 5 will focus on fractions with geometry and multiplication and division reasoning problems. <p>Year 5 will be finishing their work on Properties and Changes of Materials initially, looking at the best thermal insulators and, also, separating mixtures, using filtering and evaporation. We will then look at Living Things and their Habitats, studying the differences between the life-cycles of plants, amphibians and mammals. We will also look at which plants use sexual and asexual reproduction.</p> <p>Year 6 will be learning about the human circulatory system and its role within the body, along with finding out about factors that can have an impact upon our bodies.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">Our Locality</p>		<p>We have combined these two subjects together to have a big focus on the local history of Brighstone and how the settlement has changed through time. Children will look at maps and devise a historical walking route around the village which looks at different aspects of its history – with a particular focus on employment. They will devise an enquiry question about a local issue and collect data to help answer their question.</p>
