<p>In our English lessons, we will continue to focus on grammar and punctuation, using The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar from Grammarsaurus. We will be learning about verb phrases, subject, and subject/verb single-clause sentences. Y2 will then further develop this by using co-ordinating conjunctions to join clauses.</p>  <p>After that, we will be exploring traditional tales, including Hansel and Gretel and Little Red Riding Hood. We will be applying our knowledge and skills to write a setting description of the candy house in Hansel and Gretel, and a character description of the wolf in Little Red Riding Hood.</p> <p>Our RWI lessons will continue daily, as well as Reading lessons in which we will read and discuss a variety of picture books, and develop our vocabulary and comprehension.</p>		<p>Year 1 Place Value within 20: Children will explore and understand the value of the digits in teen numbers, explore 1 more and 1 less within 20. Addition and Subtraction within 20: Children will add by counting on, subtract by counting back, add and subtract using number bonds within 20.</p> <p>Year 2 Money: Children will count money in pounds and pence, choose notes and coins, make £1 in different ways. Multiplication and Division: Children will recognise, make and add equal groups, explore the multiplication symbol and sentences, use arrays, make equal groups for sharing and grouping, explore the 2-, 5- and 10-times table including dividing and multiplying and exploring odd and even numbers.</p>

<p>Uses of Everyday Materials We will be looking at objects and the materials from which they are made. We will consider how different materials are suited to different purposes, considering whether they are transparent, absorbent, flexible, magnetic, and also how strong they are. The children will be able to test materials for different purposes and begin to gather simple results to help us discuss what we have found out from our investigation. We will also find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.</p>	 <p>Spring 1 2025</p>		<p>In Geography this half term, we will investigate what it would be like to live in Shanghai. We will revisit our learning about the continents of the world, and will use maps and atlases to locate China and the UK. We will look at the physical and human features of both locations and make comparisons based on what we have discovered.</p>
